YEAR 7-10 EXAMS

The students in Year 7-10 are currently sitting their half yearly examinations. These assessments of learning provide teachers, students and parents with an indication of the progress students are making in each of their courses. Students have been provided with an assessment notification for each subject and this notification is also available for parents on the parent portal. The results from these examinations will be combined with other assessment undertaken throughout Semester One in the determination of grades, comments and levels of achievement of outcomes reported in the semester one report. Parents are encouraged to engage in conversations with their son's and assist them in their in preparation for these examinations.
