Edmund Rice Education Australia Touchstone Liberating Education

As a Catholic School in the Edmund Rice Tradition we promote ongoing renewal by providing opportunities for reflective practice, formation and professional development.

Edmund Rice Education Australia invites staff within their schools across Australia to attend core formation experiences that are designed to provide a time for renewal and reflection on the role that each of us play in providing a quality Catholic Education, which is underpinned by the values inherent in our touchstones. The various programs offered align with the different stages of staff experience and are available to both teaching and non-teaching staff. There are four programs including:

Galilee (the encounter begins)

An induction program for people new to EREA schools and Oceania Ministries. Galilee helps participants ground their awareness of what it means to be in community in a Catholic School in the Edmund Rice Tradition. It is also a place to grow our understanding of the Life of Jesus, the Response of Edmund and Our Participation – a participation that is open to being moved by the Spirit, Alive in Relationship and Called to Liberation.



Into the Deep (the call to leadership)

A program for 'middle' leaders in EREA schools and Oceania Ministries. Into the Deep provides participants with an opportunity to meet and connect with other people called to the service of leadership. It seeks to provide an atmosphere for sharing, reflection and exploration of the nature of leadership and to see how our work today sits alongside the work of Jesus of Nazareth and Edmund Rice as well as the many who have followed their example.



Break Every Yoke (leading for liberation)

A program for senior leaders in EREA schools and Oceania Ministries. This program provides people engaged in the service of leadership at a senior level with opportunities for personal reflection, dialogue with other leaders, and reflection on the stories that shape our identity as well as the opportunity to engage with people of other faith and cultural traditions and those on the margins. It offers participants the opportunity to experience contemporary responses to the pressing issues of our time.



Mt Sinai (encounters with the sacred)

A program for people working in Catholic education in the Edmund Rice Tradition for an extended period. Mt Sinai provides people who have been working in Catholic schools in the Edmund Rice tradition for an extended period (at least ten years), with opportunities for personal reflection, conversation with people from other schools and ministries, reflection on the stories that give us a sense of identity, as well as a chance to look to the future.



Staff from St Edward's have attended these courses throughout the year and they provide a wonderful opportunity to network with staff from other EREA schools as well as create time to reflect on our core mission as teachers in an EREA school.

Brief reflections from two St Edward's staff members who attended the Mount Sinai program last week appear below.

At the end of October, Mrs Sue Devetak, Mr John Moloney and I were nominated to attend a spirituality retreat at the Christian Brothers Centre at Mulgoa, near Penrith. It is one of a number of retreats designed for all staff from all Edmund Rice Schools.

Most of our two days was spent exploring the Touchstones, which are the essence of every Edmund Rice Community. We concentrated, in particular, on the touchstone of Inclusive Community. The Touchstones appear in Eddies' classrooms and are the cornerstones of our regular student goal setting and classroom expectations.

Our Mt Sinai retreat offered us 'Encounters With The Sacred'. It allowed us time to examine the strengths of our own school community, and provided for us a reflection on our individual role in that community. The Inclusive Community touchstone held great relevance for us, as Eddies' staff, as a result of the strong social justice consciousness we share.

While the retreat programs allow each staff to celebrate the uniqueness of their own school, they also allow each staff to celebrate the fact that we are part of a larger collective understanding of education in the Edmund Rice tradition.

August saw the team at Terrigal Basketball Stadium, where they performed exceptionally well at the BBSSSA tournament. With a record of five straight wins, the team claimed the title of BBSSSA Champions. Fine performances in the pool stage against St Leo's and Mater Maria laid the foundations for a very successful day. The team then went on to defeat St Paul's in the semi-final before facing a very determined Mackillop College in the final. The team found themselves behind by six points at half time and on the back foot. However, a change in the game tempo, coupled with outstanding play from Alex Bailey and Liam Dorfling, saw the team lift to a convincing 24-14 win.

The next stop for the team was the NSWCCC tournament. The tournament pitched us against the best school teams in the State where our skills and athleticism were sure to be tested. We were drawn in a tough pool alongside Patrician Brothers Blacktown, McCarthy College Tamworth and Edmund Rice Wollongong. The competition started well with a strong win against McCarthy College. The boys eventually overcoming some determined defence to record a strong 42-32 victory. Edmund Rice College proved a different proposition in the second game and we struggled to adjust to their style of play. Nathaniel Hobson worked tirelessly at both ends of the floor and displayed great courage when attacking the opposition's basket. Despite Nathaniel's efforts the team went down 36-45. Our last pool game against Patrician Brothers was a 'must win' fixture if we wanted to progress to the Championship finals draw. This was, however, to be our toughest opponent of the whole campaign with the team eventually losing 35-65.

Day 2 saw the side up against Trinity Goulbourn in the Plate quarter-finals. Tommie Barrett, Nathaniel McLean and Jack Conroy lead the way in a comprehensive 52-32 win. Our fast-break transition and solid rebounding were highlights of this game, and we progressed to the semi-finals. St Andrew's Maryong stood between us and a place in the final at 3pm. We started the game well, jumping to a 6-0 lead. However, a clogging style defence slowed our momentum as St Andrew's started to close on our lead. The team pressed the opposition in a high press, but were not able to close the gap, eventually losing 37-50. Despite this loss, all players displayed tenacity and sportsmanship throughout both tournaments.
