St Edward's College Uniform Expectations – a reminder before Term Three

Dear students and families,

As we move into the holidays and prepare for Term Three, we would like to remind boys of some important requirements when it comes to formal school uniform. Moreover, we'd like to thank the students who always present themselves immaculately, both in school and travelling to and from the College.

Below are some key uniform requirements, in accordance with our [College Uniform Policy](#):

- In Terms Two and Three, ties and blazers must be worn each day (excluding Friday sport for Years 7-10). This includes to and from school, in morning homeroom and assemblies.
- Students must have the correct leather shoes to accompany their school uniform with the correct socks (see above link for any clarification). With their sports uniform, skate shoes such as Vans and Converse are not permitted.
- To keep warm, students should use the grey school jumper and their blazer. Long sleeve white school shirts can be requested at the uniform shop and plain white t-shirts or singlets underneath the school shirt can add another layer. Students are not to wear hoodies and school tracksuit tops with the school uniform. This includes as they travel to and from school.

As Term Three commences, the College will be reminding students of uniform expectations with the following process:

Students with incorrect uniform will need to collect an orange slip from Pastoral Care at the start of the day. Those with a valid reason should have a note or email from parents/carers. Boys without will have their name recorded with a 'three-strikes' rule (in a term or ten-week period). Three occurrences without valid reason will result in a Thursday detention. Likewise, any student out of uniform who has not collected an orange slip at the end of the day will receive a detention.
