

KEY TERMS

ATAR

Australian Tertiary Admission Rank.

UAC

The Universities Admissions Centre is an organisation that processes applications for University admissions in NSW.

ADJUSTMENT FACTORS

Adjustment factors are automatically added to your raw ATAR by UAC if you are eligible.

SELECTION RANK (SR)

Combination of ATAR and adjustment factors.

ASSUMED KNOWLEDGE

University courses build on the knowledge learned from HSC subjects that you may have studied.

RECOMMENDED STUDIES

These subjects are relevant to your degree and will be helpful with your studies.

EARLY ENTRY PROGRAM PREFERENCES

- Applications for Early Entry Program open 8 April 2024 and can be made for free at newcastle.edu.au/early
- Early Entry Program applicants will be able to preference
 UP TO THREE University of Newcastle programs in their application
- Preference 1 should be the applicant's preferred degree
- Recommended preferences 2 and 3 are similar degrees with a lower Selection Rank that provide a pathway to preferred degree (preference 1)
- Applicants must change their preferences before the application deadline dates.

Bachelor of Exercise and Sport Science

Diploma in Science

APPLY VIA UAC

- In addition to an Early Entry Application, students can also complete an application for University of Newcastle degrees via UAC (Universities Admissions Centre)
- Students will be able to preference five degrees in their UAC application (including University of Newcastle degrees and other institutions)
- Preference 1 should be student's preferred degree
- Recommended preferences 2-5 are similar degrees with a lower Selection Rank that provide a pathway to preferred degree (preference 1)
- UAC applications assessed on student's Selection Rank (ATAR + adjustment factors)

SCHOOLS RECOMMENDATION SCHEME (SRS)

SRS offers are based on Year 11 results and the high schools rating of applicants' aptitudes and abilities in the following five study areas:

- 1. capacity for abstract thought and analysis
- 2. ability to organise ideas and articulate a position orally and in written form
- 3. ability to work and learn independently
- 4. motivation to achieve long-term goals
- 5. capacity for tertiary study.

Y12 SUBJECT SPOTLIGHT SCHEME (SSS)

The Year 12 Subject Spotlight Scheme rewards applicants' hard work and strong results in one or more subjects related to their chosen degree.

There is no separate application for this scheme – applicants simply apply through UAC and ensure the University of Newcastle is listed as their first preference before midnight on Wednesday 18 December 2024.




